

PALM COVE IS A TINY ENCLAVE OF LUXURY HOTELS AND FINE-DINING RESTAURANTS BESIDE A BEAUTIFUL PALM-FRINGED BEACH



Located about 30 minutes north of Cairns, Palm Cove village is centred around an esplanade lined with coconut palms, sheoaks and 500-year-old melaleuca trees. Hire a kayak or a bike, try fishing off the jetty or enjoy a sunset barbecue on the beach.

EAT

Dining in Palm Cove ranges from fish and chips on the beach to high-end, award-winning restaurants specialising in seasonal produce. Iconic Nu Nu **Restaurant** serves innovative modern Australian tasting menus with matching wines, **Beach Almond** does beautifully presented Asian seafood, and Vivo has great cocktails and tapas. If you're looking for something more chilled, head to the aptly named Chill at Portofino or enjoy an authentic Italian wood-fired pizza with ocean views at **Il Forno**. Little diners will love the range at The Surf Club Palm Cove or may prefer a hearty takeaway on the beach from Pete's Place.

STAY

Palm Cove may be small (with a population of approximately 2,000), but it's home to beautiful boutique hotels and resorts. Stay a stone's throw away from the beach at the iconic **Alamanda Palm Cove by Lancemore**, situated next to *that* iconic palm tree grove and indulge in their award-winning spa. Live an equally luxe life at the **Pullman Palm Cove Sea Temple Resort & Spa**, with the choice to upgrade for your own private plunge pool, or **The Reef House**, with its elegant South Pacific decor and tropical Queenslander vibes.

If you're on a budget, it doesn't mean you have to miss out on paradise, opt for the **Hotel Grand Chancellor Palm Cove**, which comes equipped with a crocodile slide for the kids, or **NRMA Palm Cove Holiday Park**, located on the beachfront by the jetty.

PLAY

If you can tear yourself away from your poolside sun lounger, there's plenty of fun to be had in Palm Cove. Start the day with the ultimate nautical adventure and kayak to nearby Double Island with **Palm Cove Water Sports**. Paddle over coral reefs and spot an abundance of rays and turtles and even discover a cave at low tide. If you fancy some water-themed fun at a later hour, the **Beach Fun Co** offers jetski, paddleboard and catamaran hire, or you can throw a line off **Palm Cove Jetty**.

Find jewellery, art and souvenirs at many boutiques dotted along **Williams Esplanade** and pick up something for your holiday wardrobe at **Beach Catwalk** and **Annie's at the Beach Boutique**. On the first Sunday of each month, Williams Esplanade becomes a bustling street bazaar of stalls selling handmade products, gifts and food during the **Palm Cove Markets**.

RELAX

Relaxing and Palm Cove come handin-hand, so head to the beach for some vitamin sea. Make sure you only swim in the patrolled area and stay in the swimming nets during the warmer months (November to May).

To relax to the max, treat yourself at one of many luxurious spas. **The Reef House Day Spa** is the only day spa in Queensland to offer Phytomer treatments, **Vie Spa** at Pullman Palm Cove has couples massages in a private suite, and **Lancemore Spa** at Alamanda finishes with a refreshing dip in a private pool overlooking the Coral Sea.

DISCOVER IDYLLIC TRINITY BEACH

TRINITY BEACH IS A RELAXED SEASIDE VILLAGE JUST NORTH OF CAIRNS WAITING TO BE EXPLORED

Trinity Beach looks like it stepped out of a dictionary's definition of "tropical paradise" and onto the Queensland map. Picture-perfect and easily accessible, 30mins from Cairns and 10mins from Palm Cove, Trinity Beach is a seaside paradise you need to visit.

EAT

With salty ocean air and the warm sun on your skin, Trinity Beach is a feast for all the senses, so it should come as no surprise that it delivers on the food scene too. Take a culinary trip to Italy at L'Unico Trattoria, which offers hand-stretched pizzas, pasta and seafood, or head to Thailand for breakfast, lunch or dinner at Tuk Tuk By The Sea, who juxtapose fiery Thai cuisine with cooling Coral Sea views. Ocean views are also on the menu at Trinity Beach Tavern, where you can pull up a stool on the balcony for a cold drink and a classic pub meal.

STAY

From family friendly seafront luxurious hilltop stays to apartments, Trinity Beach has something suitable for every stay. There's no false advertising at **On** The Beach Holiday Apartments, its seafront location and beach toys, boogie boards and pool noodles will make it a hit with the little 'uns. If you want the sea to look as beautiful from your room as it does from the sand itself, head up to Vue Trinity Beach for dreamy ocean vistas that blend seamlessly into the alluring infinity pool. If you don't fancy bringing sand home into your holiday apartment as a souvenir, Blue Lagoon Resort is located a convenient two minutes walk from the beach and has two swimming pools for you to while away your day.

PLAY

WALK TO TAYLORS POINT

For a scenic stroll, start wandering towards Taylors Point. The 2.3km loop hugs the coastline until you get to the rocks at the point and offers sweeping views over the beach and Double Island, as well as a good chance of spotting local wildlife.

FIRE UP A FREE BARBECUE

Make a day out of the beach by retreating to the shady esplanade for lunch. Trinity Beach Foreshore includes barbecues, picnic shelters, tables and toilets.

HIKE EARL HILL

You'll need to jump in the car for this one, but the short journey to Earl Hill is met with the 3.4km hiking loop. Set your phone to panorama to take in views out to the Coral Sea, the reward at the end of the incline. Remember to fill your water bottle up prior to setting off as the base is your last chance to hydrate.

TAKE A DIP

With warm weather year-round, swimming is always on the agenda at Trinity Beach. The beach is patrolled all year with stinger nets for the warmer months. Of course, most hotels also have pools.

FAMILY-FRIENDLY PLAYTIME

Bluewater Playground at Trinity Beach is any landlubbing child's dream with its multimillion dollar play equipment set on 9,000m² of tropical parkland grounds. There's also a smaller playground along the beach.

• CLIFTON BEACH

BEACH DREAMING

A chain of sandy shores lay just north of Cairns, each boasting their own unique character. Find out which of Cairns' Northern Beaches tickle your fancy.

MACHANS BEACH

With uninterrupted views of the Coral Sea from the walkway, Machans Beach is the perfect place for a waterfront wander. Many locals are partial to fishing along the beach or in the nearby creeks and rivers. Stop by **O'Sheas** with sea views for a drink or bite to eat or head to the brightly coloured **Mayhem at Machan's** for breaky or brunch.

HOLLOWAYS BEACH

Holloways Beach is the closest patrolled beach to Cairns City and is home to a handful of holiday resorts, shops and amenities. For casual dining on the beachfront, choose **Strait on the Beach**, or opt for classic and creative brunch options at **Two Blocks Cafe**. Visit on the second Sunday of every month for the **Holloways Beach Markets**.

CLIFTON BEACH

This hideaway is an unspoilt local's beach with only a small number of holiday apartments up for grabs. Take to two wheels on a leisurely 3km bike ride along the foreshore between Clifton Beach and Palm Cove. It's the ideal spot for sunrise invoking those true tropical vibes you were searching for. Much-loved restaurant, **Coco Mojo**, has an extensive menu with plenty of vegetarian and vegan options.

KEWARRA BEACH

If wood-fired pizzas and live music below a string of fairy lights on the beach sounds like your thing, then look no further than **The Beach Shack**, which operates seasonally. Fall asleep to the sound of lapping waves at **Kewarra Beach Resort & Spa** just a few steps from the beach.

YORKEYS KNOB

This quiet beachside community has accommodation options along, or close to, the esplanade. Have breaky at dog-friendly **Hidden at Yorkeys**, try kite surfing, tee off at the 18-hole **Half Moon Bay Golf Club** and round off the day at local favourite, **Yorkeys Knob Boating Club** with marina views and dollar oysters on weekends.

ELLIS BEACH

Located 5mins north of Palm Cove, Ellis Beach is a hit with the locals. Walk along the palm-fringed shores with the **Macalister Range** rising directly behind the beach, before heading for lunch and cocktails at **Ellis Beach Bar & Grill**, with \$1 oysters on Sundays. Extend your stay and enjoy even more vitamin sea by staying at **Ellis Beach Oceanfront Bungalows**.

CAIRNS HAS BEEN QUENCHING THIRSTS SINCE ITS FIRST BAR OPENED IN 1877 AND HAS ONLY BEEN PERFECTING ITS FORMS OF HYDRATION EVER SINCE

Discovering the reef and rainforest can be thirsty work. Add the fact the city has a climate that rarely (if ever) dips into single figures and there's a good chance you'll be parched come sundown. Here are some bars and breweries to check out on your next Cairns trip.

BEERS THAT BETTER THE WORLD

They say that nothing goes down better than a cold beer on a hot day and what better to sip on in the tropics than a tropical ale? The 7th Heaven Tropical Ale from Hemingway's Brewery's isn't any brew, this liquid gold contributes half of its profits to the Great Barrier Reef Legacy for the future sustainability of the city's most well-known attraction. Perched overlooking the Trinity Inlet and East Trinity, you're hitting the ultimate feel-good trifecta awesome views, great vibes and good virtue.

SET THE BAR HIGH AT THESE ROOFTOP BARS

We take your concrete jungle rooftop bars and raise you Cairns' urban jungle. Up here, watch the sunset over the mountains and lap up views of the Coral Sea with a cocktail in hand at sophisticated peak through Rocco; the palm trees of the lively Cairns Esplanade at one of Cairns' newest establishments, Whisky & Wine; or soak in the tropical vibes with a drink in hand overlooking the famous Cairns Esplanade Lagoon at Oak & Vine.

SLINK INTO SECRET BARS

Here's proof laneway bars aren't just a thing of the big smoke, but if smoky's your vibe, follow the woody scent to Three Wolves hidden down Wolf Lane in the CBD. 'Smoke on the Water' is this whisky bar's twist on an Old Fashioned; infusing bourbon, bitters and cinnamon syrup with smoked Western Red Cedar wood. Gin lovers need only to prowl a few steps to Three Wolves' sister venue, Wolf Lane Distillery whose locally-made gins are on the world stage, including native flavours such as Davidson Plum.

SOAK UP SEASIDE CHARM

The seaside doesn't get any closer than **Prawn Star**, Cairns' iconic floating seafood restaurant. Of course, while you're here for the fresh no-nonsense seafood, drinks come cheap with \$7 happy hour all day, every day. Afterwards, set your sights on **Salt House**, another noted venue of this coastal city, famous for its laidback vibes, tropical cocktails and great views.

If you're sipping on a Sunday, hop to nearby **Ollie's Italian Steakhouse** who serve \$10 tapas and cocktails from 2.30-5.30pm.

HOT SUMMER TIPS

Sip poolside at Cairns CBD's only swim-up bar, **MOKU Beach Club**. Even those not staying at **Novotel Cairns Oasis Resort** are welcome to perch poolside with a drink or two

EAT LIKE A LOCAL

TWO BLOCKS CAFE

It's rare to find a place that absolutely nails coffee, food and service but Two Blocks Cafe does it every time. Their seasonal breakfast and lunch menu puts a twist on the old favourites and brings some exciting new ones to the table. Think XO Sauce with Duck Folded Eggs or pillowy Ricotta Donuts with Miso Butterscotch.

LE CROUTON

If you rocked into Le Crouton any time after 10am on a weekend you might struggle to find much left on the menu due to its overwhelming popularity. Fresh bread, sweet and savoury pastries and ready-made baguettes are the name of the game at this unassuming French bakery in the quaint suburb of Freshwater. We often grab a couple of Smoked Salmon Baguettes on our way for a dip in the refreshing freshwater pools of Crystal Cascades.

NU NU RESTAURANT

A high-end restaurant with a superb locally-focused menu and a postcard view to boot awaits you at this Palm Cove restaurant. After you've tagged a pic of yourself under the iconic palm trees, settle in with a Nu Nu G&T using local Mt Uncle Distillery Botanic Australis Gin perfectly paired with the Wok Fried North Queensland Mudcrab & Chilli Jam.

MISS CHIEF

Date night favourite with the hubby is CBD-based bar and eatery, Miss Chief. Perched on the balcony overlooking the hustle and bustle of the street below Miss Chief's signature 'Highgarden' cocktails with Hendricks Gin and elderflower syrup can go down a little too well. Their menu is designed for sharing.

GUYALA CAFE

At Guyala the food is almost too pretty to eat – but only almost! Their Paperbark Smoked Roo-ben Sandwich based on the New York classic Reuben is a crowd favourite or you might get lucky and get to sample their 'Cray Cray' special with sous vide Painted Cray Tail and Lemon Myrtle Hollandaise.



THE FOX SMALL BAR

Life in Tropical North Queensland goes hand in hand with a good drink and nowhere better to do just that is at The Fox Small Bar in leafy Stratford. Grab a seat at the bar inside or kick back at one of the tables kerbside and peruse the top notch drinks list adorned with locally distilled spirits from their own Wolf Lane Distillery. A short but sharp antipasto menu perfectly complements their extensive cocktail list.

HARUKA JAPANESE CUISINE

This authentic Japanese café in suburban Edge Hill has one of the best value lunches in Cairns. Their \$15 bento box menu changes weekly and the seafood is fresh as fresh can be. Book ahead because the locals know how great this little gem is.

PHETYAI THAI

A Foodvixen family favourite for a cheap but satisfying Friday night dinner. Previously a tiny hole in the wall eatery, Phetyai Thai has recently moved to a larger more accommodating space due to their popularity. The service is quick and the food is plentiful. Their Crispy Pork With Rice is epic value and bloody delicious.

AH-ROOM

Tucked down an unsuspecting laneway in the heart of the city is the cutest Korean dessert cafe you ever did see. Their pastries and cakes at this little hole in the wall cafe are forever changing but think Tiramisu Dacquiose, Matcha Terrine and Basque Cheesecake.



Wind your way through stalls of farm-fresh produce to find mangoes as large as your head, quirky fruits and locally produced cheeses. Pick up a legendary Vietnamese iced coffee at **Annee's Caphê Sua Da** and satisfy your sweet tooth at **Frenchie's Patisserie** or **The Grateful Coconut**. Fancy something savoury? Leaving Cairns City, the further south you travel, the greener the scenery becomes. Seas of sugarcane give way to mountains on either side covered in thick World Heritage rainforest. As such, it should come as no surprise that this landscape is laden with spectacular swimming holes and epic hikes.

For the latter, make a beeline to **Gordonvale** to hike the iconic **Walshs Pyramid**, standing at 922m elevation. Soak in the panoramic views at the top, from mountain ranges to the tapestry of farmlands and all the way to the sea.

At the base of The Pyramid's closest neighbour and Queensland's secondhighest peak, **Mount Bellenden Ker**, find the trailhead for the breathtaking **Behana Gorge**. This undulating track weaves through rainforest and past lookouts to the stunning centrepiece, Clamshell Falls. After a 3.2km hike in, there's nothing better than jumping into the icy waters to cool down.

For a more relaxed swim and one that's also wheelchair accessible, keep heading south to **Babinda Boulders**. Be sure to make a pit-stop at the famous **Babinda Bakery** to stock up on a picnic to enjoy on the grassy lawns or, if you're lucky, at one of the picnic tables.

Spend your day floating around the emerald waters, and take the 1.3km return **Devils Pool Walk** to discover the tragic Dreamtime story of Oolana and Dyga. Admire the swirling waters of Devils Pool from two lookouts.

Tip Explore Babinda Creek on a self-guided kayak or stand-up paddleboard with **Babinda Kayaking**

The active and adventurous will find the southern trailhead of the **Goldfield Trail** just by Babinda Boulders. This 19km historic trail winds through lush rainforest and picturesque creek crossings. Discover a lovely campground with a swimming hole approximately halfway, and another at the northern trailhead at **Goldsborough Valley** (the latter accessible by car).

If you like a mixture of chill and thrill, a little bit chilled, head down to nature's water park at **Josephine Falls** flowing from Queensland's highest mountain, **Mount Bartle Frere**. An easy 600m stroll will take you to the cascading waterfall with a falls lookout and lower swimming hole featuring a natural water slide.

Swap freshwater for saltwater with Frankland Island Reef Cruises. This tour encompasses rainforest, river and reef environments, with the first part of your journey cruising down the Mulgrave River, rich with wildlife. From there, it's a short cruise to Normanby Island, with stunning fringing coral and rainforest. Take a guided walk with a marine biologist and Master Reef Guide to understand how truly special these environments are.

This uninhabited archipelago is also renowned as one of the top islands to spot bucket-list marine life including turtles, clown fish, manta rays, giant clams and dugongs, best discovered on their optional snorkel safari tour.

Tip Visit Bramston Beach for a relaxing, uncrowded beach getaway

After a day (or two!) of exploring, wind down with a coldie at one of the many charming pubs peppered throughout this area. Discover a slice of history at the **Babinda State Hotel** (the only pub of its time constructed and operated by the Queensland Government), sip with a view of the beautiful **Little Mulgrave River** at the **Mountain View Hotel** or soak in the small town vibes of **Fishery Falls Hotel**.

WATER WONDERLAND

CRYSTAL CASCADES

Located only 25mins from Cairns CBD in the Redlynch Valley, Crystal Cascades is a series of swimming holes and cascading falls. Venture to the end of the track for the most impressive of the falls or simply bring your floaty and retreat to one of the more shady pools along the way.

FAIRY FALLS

Tucked away in the dense rainforest close to Crystal Cascades is Fairy Falls, a picturesque waterfall as magical as its name. Some rock hopping is required to reach this natural plunge pool, but the end result, and the cooling swim, is more than worth it.

BABINDA BOULDERS

Babinda Boulders, located around an hour south of Cairns, features an incredible emerald-hued open swimming hole flanked with lush green rainforest and dotted with huge granite boulders. The refreshing water is cool year-round with a large picnic area and free barbecues by the water.

JOSEPHINE FALLS

Just an hour south of Cairns Josephine Falls is nature's water park, with a natural rockslide being the main attraction of the beautiful cascades. It's an easy 600m walk to the bottom swimming hole, with wheelchair access available to the viewing platform at the top pool.

BEHANA GORGE

Hike through the rainforest on a 3.2km trek on a fully sealed path to the stunning Behana Gorge. Make regular pit stops to cool off in the crystalline creek before reaching the grand finale; Clamshell Falls – a series of cascading waterfalls dotted with rock pools.

STONEY CREEK

Local favourite Stoney Creek is an easy drive from the Cairns CBD. A track meanders through the rainforest, over a small footbridge and continues parallel along the creek with many pools offering a cool refuge on the 25min walk to Old Weir Falls, the final destination of your journey.

SUMMER IN THE TROPICS

Summer is a feast for the senses. Feel the invigorating cool water of a rainforest waterfall, see the reef in crystal-clear clarity, inhale deeply for the fresh scent of rain, listen to the wildlife come alive as the land is rejuvenated, and taste sweet tropical produce as summer species flourish.

Summer is an important part of the tropical weather cycle and plays a vital role in the revitalisation of plant and animal life. The low hanging clouds on the mountains and the vibrant tones of green of the landscape will be enough to inspire your inner Monet.

With summer comes beautiful warm tropical rains. These typically run over summer and autumn though patterns will vary from year to year. The sun still peeks out of the clouds and it doesn't mean non-stop rain – you can squeeze in plenty of sunny beach or pool days during this period – but even if you are caught in the rain, grab a pina colada and embrace it! There's nothing quite as refreshing as a tropical shower.

It's important to always follow the advice from Queensland Parks and never venture into out of bounds or dangerous zones or flooded waters to prevent serious injury or death. During their peak, many swimming holes are too dangerous and should only be observed from afar.

FIVE REASONS TO VISIT THE TROPICS IN SUMMER

WATERFALLS UPON WATERFALLS

If you've ever seen photos of Barron Falls in winter compared to after a good dose of summer rain, you'll understand. If not, prepare yourself for the most epic waterfall hunting of your life. Waterfalls that are usually calm start raging, streams that are normally a trickle begin to thunder, and waterfalls seem to appear in every crevice of the surrounding mountains. It's enough to make you want to pack up your life and become a full-time waterfall chaser.

TIP Take Skyrail Rainforest Cableway to get unparalleled views of Barron Falls



A FRUITY HEAVEN

While this time of year is usually synonymous with the colour green, the fruits are anything but - tangy pink lychees and sweet yellow mangoes decorate the trees and markets

become a stockpile of fresh local produce. Weave your way through Rusty's Markets stocking up on mangoes that are as cheap per kilo as most supermarkets charge for one, or find strange exotic fruit you've never heard of.

WILD ABOUT WILDLIFE

With trees in peak fruiting, wildlife is out and about as food is plentiful. Cassowaries roam extensively with their young through this time while birds, frogs and other unique wildlife

of Tropical North Queensland (think tree climbing kangaroos – yes, it's a thing) might be spotted while you explore.

SEE THE REEF IN HIGH-DEF

Northerly winds can bring calmer seas and incredible water clarity on the Great Barrier Reef through summer. The pleasant temperature of the water and active marine life on the reef means you'll never want to get out. In early December, you may even be able to catch the annual coral spawning.

TIP The Great Dividing Range tends to draw most of the rain to the coast often when it's raining on shore, the sun is shining at the reef

IT'S A SPECTACLE

There's no doubt, nature feels alive during summer. Whether you're watching an afternoon storm roll in, amidst real tropical rain, finding raging waterfalls, listening to the chorus of the rainforest, or just taking in the abundant green of the landscape, it's the kind of place that is so remarkable you'll be telling your grandchildren about it one day.

TIP Cozy up in a secluded rainforest cabin to enjoy this environment in all its glory



Get the adrenaline pumping by rafting down rivers surrounded by ancient rainforests, or visit an outback painted green by the regenerative rain, giving you a new perspective on this Aussie icon.

WINTER One of the things that everyone loves about the tropics is that you can enjoy an outdoorsy lifestyle all year. While other places are huddled inside around heaters, in Tropical North Queensland you can indulge in cocktails by the beach or laze by the pool at a luxury resort.

Flying into Cairns, not only are you able to see the brilliant tapestry of the Great Barrier Reef from above, but you'll be able to see the city's close proximity to the world's oldest continuously surviving tropical rainforest – at least 130 million years old – the Wet Tropics World Heritage Area.

The Wet Tropics World Heritage Area covers a vast swathe of almost 900,00ha of pristine wilderness, stretching from Cooktown to Paluma, and encompassing some 30 National Parks and at least 20 Rainforest Aboriginal tribal groups, 120 clans and 8 language groups.

This rainforest boasts an astounding number of claims to fame; from the first flowering plants to the smallest and most primitive species of kangaroo as well as Australia's only tree climbing kangaroos; over 2,800 vascular plant species (700 of which are endemic); 230 butterfly species; and 40% of Australia's bird species including its very own avian icon (aka dinosaur), the Southern Cassowary.

The list is never-ending but what else can you expect from the oldest rainforest on the planet?

EXPLORE AT GREAT HEIGHTS

For a comprehensive insight into the history, evolution and extraordinary beauty of this ancient rainforest, hop aboard **Skyrail Rainforest Cableway**. Skyrail grants you access to views that no other experience in the region is able to offer, skimming over the mesmerising canopy where the forest floor seems to disappear into oblivion below.

Before embarking, download the **Skyrail Interpretive App** for educational insights and fun augmented reality experiences along the journey. Join a ranger-guided tour at **Red Peak Station** and take your time wandering through the engaging **Rainforest Discovery Zone** to learn even more about this spectacular and irreplaceable bioregion.

TIP Pair a trip on Skyrail with **Kuranda Scenic Railway** for more incredible views and interesting history

To explore great heights on two feet, find a network of hiking trails departing from Kamerunga, around 25mins drive from Cairns CBD. The scenic **Douglas Track** takes around 2-3hrs return and climbs to **Glacier Rock**, permitting you panoramic views over Cairns and the Coral Sea. It's best done early to catch the sunrise and before the heat of the day sets in.

Smiths Track climbs up the opposite (and very steep) ridgeline of Stoney Creek Gorge. Eventually the track interconnects with the Douglas Track however you can just choose to complete parts of the trail. Take a short detour from **Toby's Lookout** to a grove of giant kauri pines and a shallow swimming hole. Upon return of both tracks, cool off in the shady pools of **Stoney Creek**.

INNER CITY GREENS

Only five minutes from the Cairns CBD, you'll find yourself in the lush inner-city suburb of **Edge Hill**, home to the **Cairns Botanic Gardens** and **Centenary Lakes**. The gardens house one of the best exhibitions of tropical plants, both native and exotic, in Australia. Sections of the gardens are only open between 7:30am-5:30pm daily, however simply strolling down leafy **Collins Avenue** or through the boardwalks of Centenary Lakes can satisfy your nature fix.

Those after more of a challenge can tackle the popular **Mount Whitfield Conservation Park** walking tracks – Red, Yellow, Blue and Green Arrows – which venture into the 300ha forested range just behind the Botanic Gardens, and are a great way to see the rainforest and keep active without leaving the city. Tracks vary in length and difficulty, but all feature scenic lookout points and varied terrain.

RAINFOREST ROAD TRIP

Pack a picnic and hit the road for a scenic drive up to Lake Morris (CopperIode Dam). The old adage "the journey is as good as the destination" is a tough call when the final destination is as beautiful as Lake Morris, but when the road is fringed with dozens of Jurassic-looking tree ferns and dotted with spectacular lookouts over Cairns City, it holds true. Once at the top, the magnificent Lamb Range towering over the lake makes the perfect backdrop to enjoy a picnic lunch. To explore from the water, you'll need to book with CopperIode Fish & Kayak.

Lake Morris is accessible from 8am to 6pm every day. Drive carefully as this is a popular training route for cyclists and cassowaries are also occasionally spotted along the way.

Whether you find yourself eye to eye with a Green Sea Turtle on the reef or connect to the land with an Indigenous Guide, the array of eco-accredited, sustainable experiences ensure that you are leaving nothing more than footprints (or fin waves) behind.

For a luxurious stay that gives back more than it takes from the environment, check into one of the **Crystalbrook Collection** hotels. The three sibling properties, **Flynn**, **Riley** and **Bailey** pride themselves on responsible luxury and come with all the indulgent trimmings including on-site restaurants, pools and spas.

Swap Esplanade views for seadrenched vistas of the Trinity Inlet at eco-certified **Pullman Reef Hotel Casino** and finish the day with a twilight swim under the stars.

Sleep tight on island time at **Fitzroy Island Resort**, which is single use plastic free, supports the nearby **Turtle Rehabilitation Centre** and has helped to fund the coral trees off the island planted by **Reef Restoration Foundation**. A trip to the tropics wouldn't be complete without exploring the Great Barrier Reef and on **Passions of Paradise** you breathe easy through your snorkel, knowing that your trip is fully carbon neutral.

To forge a timeless connection to this wonder, explore it with Traditional Owners, who have maintained deep connections to the reef for thousands of years, on **Dreamtime Dive & Snorkel**.

Many reef operators offer tours with a **Master Reef Guide**, the world's leading reef experts, interpreters and storytellers. Visiting with a Master Reef Guide ensures you leave equipped with all the knowledge on how to help this natural icon, thus able to go forth and spread the word.

If you thought your trip couldn't get any greener, a trip to the Wet Tropics World Heritage Rainforest is calling. Soar over the rainforest canopy with **Skyrail Rainforest Cableway**, an experience that is Advanced Eco Certified and Climate Action Certified. To explore a little further afield, eco-certified **Wait-a-While Rainforest Tours** specialise in small group nature-spotting tours departing Cairns.

Like we said, being green comes easily in Cairns – you could even say it's in our nature.

HOW DOES Your garden grow?

Gardeners come in all shapes and sizes, and those working to revitalise the world's most iconic coral garden are vital to its future. Marine Biologist and PhD canditate, Lorna Howlett, talks coral restoration on the Great Barrier Reef.

It's 1pm on a Tuesday afternoon and Lorna Howlett isn't exactly in a typical office environment. She's underwater with a tiny *Acropora millepora* coral fragment in her hand and is about to attach it onto a bare rock face on the Great Barrier Reef. Fastforward two years and that tiny coral piece has flourished into a vibrant coral garden (pictured).

Lorna is one of the legendary reef warriors who work for the **Coral Nurture Program**, a unique partnership between tourism and science, which aims to assist in the recovery of "high value" reef sites on the Great Barrier Reef.

Lorna's PhD topic is the "Optimisation and ecological effects of coral restoration on the Great Barrier Reef". She's been assessing the use of a novel device, Coralclip (used to attach coral fragments onto areas of bare rock on the reef), conducting surveys to determine the success of the Coralclip, and monitoring reef sites.

"For this I outplanted 20 coral fragments altogether but, since the start of the Coral Nurture Program, the tourism operators have outplanted over 40,000!"

A few nautical miles across the big blue, another team of underwater gardeners are placing coral fragments on coral tree frames, producing ocean-based nurseries for these coral pieces to grow and thrive. In under a year, these fragments will be reattached to the reef where they will continue to grow. This team is part of **Reef Restoration Foundation**, who aim to produce one million new corals on the Great Barrier Reef by 2026.

Reef warriors have gone above and beyond to help the reef and Experience Co is no exception. GBR Biology, the tourism company's research education department, and have literally gone to Mars (Incorporated) to implement a solution. The coral rubble stabilisation project, which was developed by Mars Incorporated, uses steel grid structures called "reef stars" to stabilise fields of loose coral fragments. Pieces of coral are attached to the structures and are used to fill gaps between patches of natural live coral.


As these lovingly-planted coral gardens continue to flourish and provide an ecosystem for all creatures great and small, these gardeners continue their journey of cultivation. They may not be seen by many, but their contributions will be seen by generations to come.

CHOOSE YOUR OWN ADVENTURE

Adventure means something different for everyone. It's not always about getting the adrenaline racing, it's about seeing the world from a new perspective.

PADDLE DOWN PRISTINE WATERS

If you'd rather relax than rush, set your own pace and glide along the crystal-clear Babinda Creek with **Babinda Kayaking**. Hire a kayak or stand-up paddleboard and wind your way between Queensland's two highest mountains alongside fish, turtles, and the occasional platypus before pulling up on the banks for a picnic lunch. Good news if you're travelling with your pooch, dogs are welcome to join you on this tour.

FLOAT LIKE A LOCAL

Up the ante a little with **Cairns Adventure Group** and float like the locals do on an inflatable tube down one of two idyllic rainforest waterways – Behana Gorge or the Mulgrave River. While much of this experience is chilled, you'll also tackle some small rapids sure to get the heart racing.

MEET SHARKS IN THE DARK While technicolour fish and

coral may be on your list of

things to spot during a night dive, you'll want to prepare for the main attraction as a shiver of reef sharks surround your liveaboard vessel with **Divers Den**. Experienced divers are invited to suit up for the ultimate close encounter, while others can enjoy the action from the water's surface with a mask and snorkel.

TIP If you don't have enough time for an overnight expedition, or simply can't get enough of the experience, take the plunge with sharks at **Cairns Aquarium**

CAST YOUR LINE WITH AN EXPERT

The waters of Cairns are some of the world's best fishing grounds with the seas, rivers and tidal estuaries teeming with fish. Board a fishing charter with **Fish Tales Cairns Charters** or **Cairns Reef Fishing** to have an experienced local guide you to the best fishing spots as well as provide advice on which type of lure and bait to use. If you're lucky to hook a fish or two (or more!), they'll also help with identifying the type of fish, whether it should be kept or returned, and help you clean, fillet and cook your catch.

HIT THE TRAILS

With 700kms of mountain biking trails easily accessible from Cairns, both downhill adrenaline junkies and easygoing family riders are able to find a track that suits. Located an easy 20mins drive north of Cairns airport, the world-famous Smithfield Mountain Bike Park offers more than 60km of green, blue and black-rated trails that twist through spectacular vineclad jungle, over clear-flowing streams and along jagged ridges that overlook the Great Barrier Reef.

For those that prefer two legs over two wheels, bushwalking options are almost infinite with the Great Dividing Range hugging the city. Conquer Queensland's highest mountain, pack your bags for a multi-day adventure or hike to incredible rainforest waterfalls.

THREE HIKES TO CONQUER

GLACIER ROCK

A favourite amongst locals for its ease of access and stunning views, Glacier Rock via The Douglas Track is a challenging but rewarding hike located a short 25mins drive from Cairns. The trailhead starts at the popular Stoney Creek swimming hole which is a welcome place to cool off on your return.

WALSHS PYRAMID

This 6km return trail steeply climbs to the summit standing at 922m rewarding you with incredible views over the patchwork of sugarcane farmlands below as well as down the thick, lush rainforests of the Bellenden Ker Range to and towards the Goldsborough Valley.

3 MOUNT BARTLE FRERE As Queensland's highest peak, standing at 1622m elevation, the challenging hike to Mount Bartle Frere's summit ventures through thick World Heritage

rainforest, across mossy creek crossings and boulder fields culminating with expansive views to the coast and over the Atherton Tablelands. The trail can be completed in a day or you can camp at the top.

A D R E N A L I N E JUNKIE

So you've tackled mountain-biking trails or conquered the highest peaks and now you're looking for your next adrenaline-inducing activity? Here's what to do in Cairns.

JUMP OFF AUSTRALIA'S ONLY BUNGY TOWER

Set in the rainforest 20mins north of Cairns CBD at **Skypark by AJ Hackett**, test your thrills with 16

different jump styles on offer. These include everything from a graceful swan dive all the way to riding a BMX bike off a roof. If you're not quite up to taking the leap, soar from 45m at speeds of up to 120km/h on the Giant Jungle Swing, or Walk the Plank on their newest attraction.

GET A BIRD'S EYE VIEW Not even your drone Could capture

The aerial views of farmlands, cityscapes, mountain peaks, snaking rivers and coral sea are ones not often seen by people. Be one of the few who can claim witness to it with **Skydive Cairns**. While you may struggle to take in the glistening green and blue landscape while plummeting at over 200km per hour during your 60-second freefall, you'll have up to seven minutes to soak up the scenery once the parachute opens.

DISCOVER A DIFFERENT SIDE TO CAIRNS' WATERFALLS

There's waterfall chasing and then there's **Cairns Canyoning**. See a different side to some of Cairns' waterways as you abseil, zipline, slide and leap down incredible freshwater creeks surrounded by dense tropical rainforest. There are several different adventures to choose from, including Behana Gorge and Crystal Cascades to the advanced Spillway tour.

TACKLE THE RAPIDS

How many cities can launch a raft on grade 2 and 3 rapids only 20mins from the CBD? Get the adrenaline racing with **Raging Thunder** on a half day white water rafting tour down the Barron Gorge. It's a place of raw natural beauty with the gorge, cloaked in World Heritage rainforest, towering either side of you as paddle your way down the river – sometimes furiously, sometimes leisurely.

TIP They also off a family rafting tour specifically catered for families with childred aged 6-11 years

MINI ROAD TRIPSFROM CAIRNS

Discover local specialties and hidden gems on a short road trip from Cairns.

Q CAIRNS TO YUNGABURRA

Brace yourself for a spot of scenic driving; this road trip is best explored via the **Gillies Range**, the famous stretch of tarmac packing 263 corners over 19kms with an 800m elevation gain.

Emerging from the rainforest, you'll find yourself in the rolling hills of the **Atherton Tablelands** before arriving at the quaint, historic town of **Yungaburra**. From here, you can explore the **Crater Lakes National Park**, discover giant ancient trees, enjoy a spot of shopping or some Devonshire tea.

Q CAIRNS TO ETTY BAY

Located 90mins south of **Cairns** near the art deco town of **Innisfail**, **Etty Bay** is known as one of the region's most scenic beaches. But what really makes this little cove so special is its inhabitants. Home to the magnificent Southern Cassowary, your chances of spotting these notoriously elusive birds roaming the beachfront here are pretty high.

Be sure to stock up on picnic goods from the famous **Oliveri's Continental Deli** and roadside fruit stalls along the way. Pair your trip with a visit to **Paronella Park** or to discover the ultimate love story set, or **Mamu Tropical Skywalk** to see the rainforest from the canopy.

♥ CAIRNS TO THE WATERFALL CIRCUIT

What do you get when you have high altitude, mountains and rocky outcrops? Find your answer on the aptly-named **Waterfall Circuit** that lures travellers inland.

Hit the road to the **Atherton Tablelands** and follow the signs to **Millaa Millaa Falls**, which is straight out of a fairytale. Then drive 8kms to the beautiful **Zillie Falls** and take in the tumbling waters from a viewing platform. Complete your waterfall hopping with a refreshing dip at **Ellinjaa Falls**.

Q CAIRNS TO CHILLAGOE

Head from the coastal city of Cairns to the dry bushlands near **Mareeba**, to the rocky outcrops of **Chillagoe**. After climbing the Kuranda Range, soothe your decaffeinated soul at **Skybury Coffee** and take a detour to the invigorating **Emerald Creek Falls**.

Keep your eyes peeled for giant termite nests as you travel inland to the **Chillagoe-Mungana Caves National Park**. Join a guide to explore three majestic caves and explore three more self-guided caves on your own. Step back in time at the historic **Chillagoe Smelters** before watching the sunset over **Balancing Rock**.

THE DRIVE OF YOUR LIFE

WELCOME TO THE GREAT BARRIER REEF DRIVE, THE ULTIMATE STRETCH OF PARADISE PEPPERED WITH PALM-FRINGED BEACHES AND LUSH RAINFOREST

DAY 1

Your adventure begins in Cairns City. Beach bums can beach hop their way along Cairns' Northern beaches, from the chilled local **Holloways Beach** to the stunning oceanfront restaurants at **Trinity Beach**. Pull into **Palm Cove** for a walk down *that* palm tree line and treat yourself to a gelato whilst wandering on the sandy shores. Choose a base for the night before hitting the road in the morning.

DAY 2

As you head north, stop for a coffee or breakfast at **Ellis Beach**, a beautiful stretch of sand where the rainforest tumbles down to the sea. Little kids and big kids alike can test their croc-o-dial at **Hartley's Crocodile Adventures**, located between Cairns and Port Douglas. If you prefer more beach time, there's so many beaches along this stretch that you may just find one all for yourself.

Fuel up with lunch at **Osprey's Restaurant** at **Thala Beach Nature Reserve** and gaze at unsurpassed views of the coastline and Coral Sea. Stay here or head to **Port Douglas**, and choose

from an array of pool-fringed resorts, awesome restaurants and stylish shops.

DAY 3

Start your day with a dreamy sunrise on Four Mile Beach. Grab breakfast from Choo Choos at the Marina then hit the road and head back onto the Great Barrier Reef Drive. Head 20mins north to Mossman Gorge, a series of tumbling cascades flanked by stunning rainforest and join a Ngadiku Dreamtime Walk with Traditional Owners. Make way to the Daintree River to search for crocodiles on a river cruise with Solar Whisper Wildlife Cruises then head to Daintree Ecolodge and sleep tight in the world's oldest rainforest.

DAY 4

Cross the **Daintree River** and wind your way through lush rainforests and beachside hamlets. Experience panoramic views at **Alexandra Lookout** and explore the rainforest canopy at all levels at the **Daintree Discovery Centre**. Take a walk on one of the free rainforest boardwalks, cool off with a dip in **Mason's Creek** and taste local flavours at **Daintree Ice Cream Company**. Make your way to **Cape Tribulation** and finish your day with a cooling swim at the **Emmagen Creek** swimming hole.

If Cairns is your destination and you have a kids in tow then you'll find a heap of activities that will entertain your family and guarantee fond memories for years to come. Follow **Adventure Mumma** on Instagram or Facebook for more family-friendly tips on Cairns.

DINING

There is no lack of family-friendly eateries around Cairns. On the weekend check out **Rusty's Markets** for its diverse range of eateries plus the opportunity to purchase some fresh tropical fruit.

Dundee's at the Cairns Aquarium has a large saltwater aquarium as its backdrop and down at the Cairns Marlin Marina is **Prawn Star**, where you can channel your inner pirate and enjoy some fresh Aussie seafood on the back of a trawler.



EXPLORE CAIRNS ESPLANADE

It's a fun recreational strip that follows the city's shoreline that you can easily explore on foot. First stop should be the **Cairns Esplanade Lagoon** for its sandy beach, shade sails, fountains, and plenty of shallow sections for kids to play.

Two playgrounds worthy of a visit are **Muddy's Playground**, which has a splash park, climbing frames, swings, and a flying fox and the **Figtree Playground**, an expansive treehouse located under a massive fig tree, right by waterfront **Wharf One Cafe**.

TROPICAL ISLAND FUN

Just off the coast lie a couple of islands that are only a short boat ride away. Pick **Green Island** and you can relax on the sandy beach, spot turtles off the jetty and explore the **Marine Melanesia** attraction, home to Cassius the croc.

Fitzroy Island has a coastal rainforest walk that will take you to **Nudey Beach**, the **Cairns Turtle Rehabilitation Centre** and a resort that is perfect for a family stay.



KURANDA SCENIC RAILWAY & **SKYRAIL RAINFOREST CABLEWAY** The iconic Kuranda Scenic Railway

meanders up the range to Kuranda with views of Cairns and beyond, Stoney Creek Falls and Barron Falls. To complete the journey, hop onboard Skyrail Rainforest Cableway and cruise above the ancient rainforest canopy. Don't

forget to hop off and join a ranger-guided boardwalk tour.

TRAVEL TO THE OUTER BARRIER REEF

Pontoons on the Outer Barrier Reef are a great place to visit if you have kids. Sunlover Reef Cruises pontoon has a water slide that loops from their sun deck into the sea below. There's also has an underwater observatory, a touch tank and a tasty lunch menu catered by Nu Nu Restaurant.



EXPLORE CAIRNS CBD

There's plenty of activities for families to do within a few blocks of Cairns CBD. The **Cairns Aquarium** features fishes of the Great Barrier Reef, and those living in the mangrove habitats and freshwater river zones.

For families that like a bit of a challenge check out the ropes course at the Cairns ZOOM & Wildlife Dome (age limits apply). Here you can zipline over their resident crocodile, Goliath, enjoy a birds-eye view of Cairns on their Dome Climb and experience interactive wildlife shows.

STAY AT A RESORT WITHIN WALKING DISTANCE OF THE SEA Stay anywhere along Williams Esplanade in Palm Cove or Trinity **Beach** and you'll have direct access to a tropical sandy beach. The **Novotel Cairns Oasis Resort** is a winner for its sandy lagoon and swim up pool bar (for parents).

SKIPPER YOUR OWN BOAT

Down at the Marlin Marina is Cairns Boat Hire where you can hire out a pontoon boat and explore and fish the Trinity Inlet. These boats don't require a boat license, have barbecues on-board and can easily fit up to eight people.

BIKE THE NORTHERN BEACH TRAIL

Explore the sandy beaches north of Cairns at your own pace and hire some bikes and eScooters from Biked at Palm Cove. From here you can head south and follow the Northern Beaches Leisure Trail all the way to Yorkeys Knob.



CHECK OUT BRANSFORDS **FISHING STORE**

Drive north to **Clifton Beach** and you can't miss the tail of a giant marlin on the roof of Bransford's Tackle Shop. Inside you'll find the rest of the marlin's impressive body and learn about the history of Cairns fishing. Purchase a family fishing kit and throw a line in at the **Palm Cove Jetty** or off the fishing jetty near the Cairns Figtree Playground.
