What's New in Cairns & Great Barrier Reef

TOURS AND ATTRACTIONS

Jump on a jetski and whizz around Pajinka, the northern-most tip of Australia, with a First Nations-led jetski tour launching on 25 May. Pafetai Morseau from Badu Island has founded <u>Cape York Jetski Tours</u> to showcase the remote region's culture and history as part of an action-packed jetski tour that can also take in the Torres Strait islands. Fishing and trips to remote art centres are among the options for the tours departing from Seisa in Cape York Peninsula.

Cuddling a koala and seeing woodland creatures while learning about conservation and sustainability can be done in less than half a day in the Cairns CBD with the opening of <u>Cairns Koalas & Creatures</u>. Cairns' newest attraction opened on 3 May providing an educational and family-oriented attraction showcasing Tropical North Queensland's diverse ecosystems from the Great Barrier Reef to the outback.

<u>Passions of Paradise</u> has launched daily citizen science tours on the Great Barrier Reef for experienced divers departing from Cairns. Certified divers can now choose the Marine Biologist for a Day program on any day of the week and help to monitor coral planting undertaken through the Coral Nurture Program with the Passions crew who have planted more than 9000 corals on Hastings Reef off Cairns.

A private <u>croc feeding experience</u> and a private <u>nocturnal tour</u> have been introduced at Wildlife Habitat to give guests an intimate insight into animal behaviour and habitat conservation. A professional croc keeper guides the croc feeding experience and wildlife keepers lead the two-hour Your WildNIGHT Habitat offering encounters with elusive marsupials as they come to life in their natural habitats.

Embark on Wildside Adventures' new 'Get Dunk'ed' tour on Dunk Island. Experience the adrenaline rush of speeding around this tropical paradise to explore sandy beaches, coral reefs, hiking trails, and secret caves against a stunning Jurassic backdrop, and snorkelling or relaxing at Coconut Bay. Limited to 10 people per journey, this 4-hour tour includes friendly guides, snorkelling gear, and refreshments. Departs twice daily from Mission Beach and is priced at \$150.

<u>Cairns Aquarium</u> has been ranked the favourite experience for shore excursions worldwide by passengers on Viking Cruises. Staff from the Aquarium's education team join passengers on their coach transfers to talk about the Great Barrier Reef and the Wet Tropics before they tour its 71 exhibits and hear from wildlife educators at each of the four amphitheatres.

These enhancements, guided by Queensland's Year of Accessible Tourism 2023-2024 and the Queensland Tourism Industry Council's (QTIC) Accessible Tourism program caters to neurodiverse, hearing, and vision-impaired visitors. New accessibility features include a guidebook for the hearing impaired, an audio guide for the vision impaired, a social script for neurodiverse visitors, improved navigation for wheelchair users, and the introduction of an accessibility page on the website.

EVENTS
